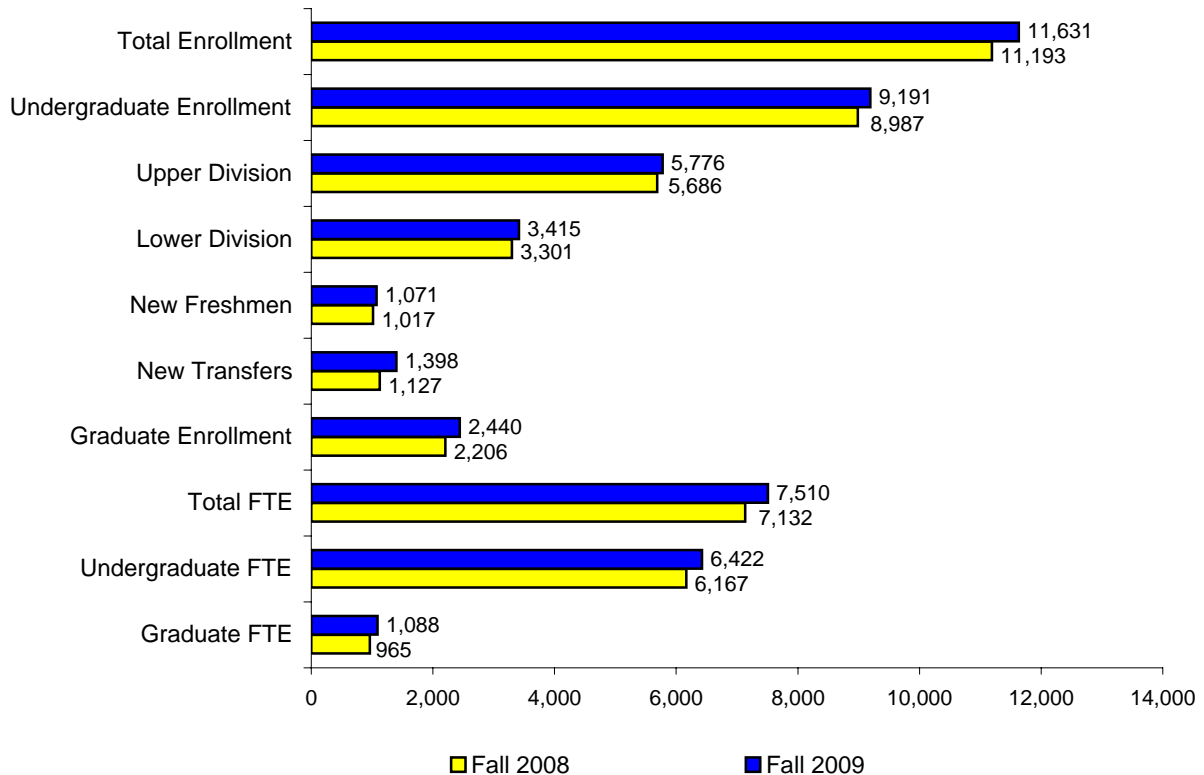

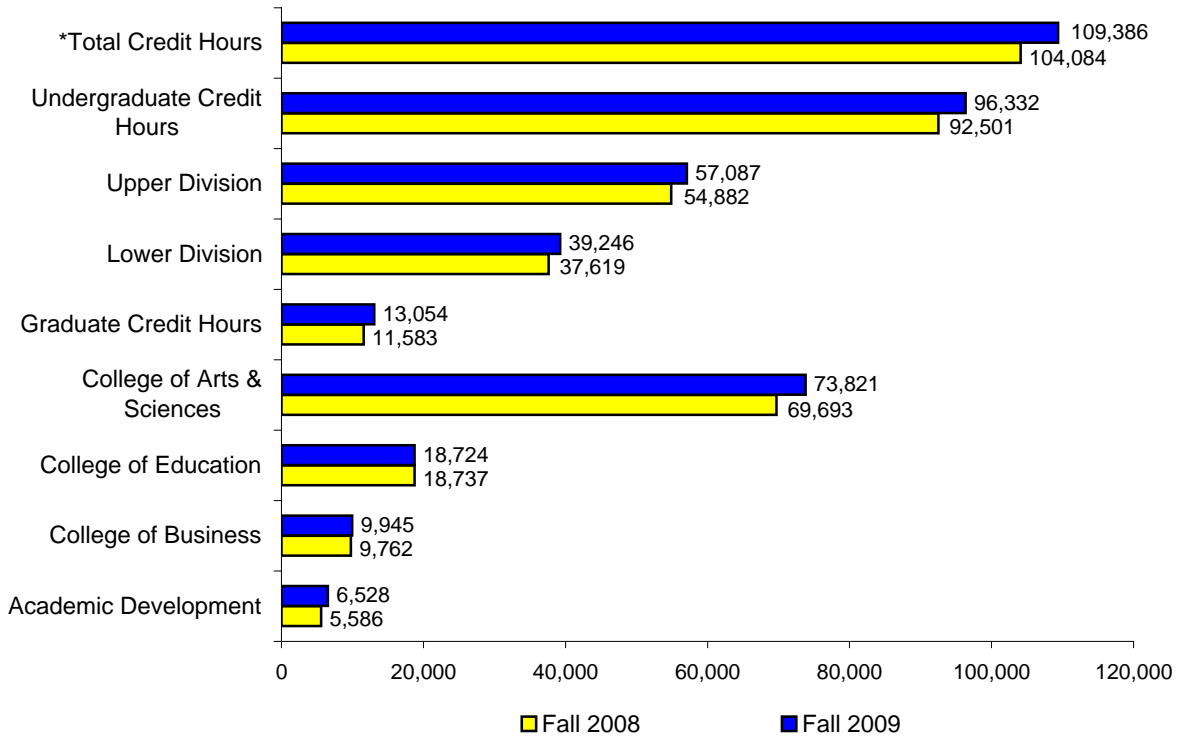

Student Enrollment and FTE



- ❖ Total enrollment for Fall 2009 was 11,631. This represents a 3.9% increase from the prior fall; total FTE also increased by 5.3%.
- ❖ Undergraduate enrollment showed an increase of 2.3% and an increase of 4.1% in FTE.
- ❖ New freshmen increased by 5.3% while new transfers showed the largest increase, up 24% from Fall 2008 (from 1,127 to 1,398).
- ❖ Fall 2009 showed a large increase of 10.6% for graduate enrollment and an even greater increase in graduate FTE, up 12.7% from Fall 2008.

Student Hours by Level and by College



*Total Credit Hours includes Honors, NSEP, and non-traditional credit hours.

- ❖ Total credit hours generated during the Fall 2009 session increased from the prior fall by 5.1%.
- ❖ Undergraduate credit hours also increased by 4.1%. A drill down shows that this overall increase was distributed equally between lower level and upper level. For the Graduate College credit hours were up by 12.7%, from 11,583 to 13,054.
- ❖ Among the colleges, student hours from Fall 2008 to Fall 2009 were flat for Education and Business, but increased 5.9% for Arts and Science and a full 16.9% for Academic Development (from 5,586 to 6,528).
