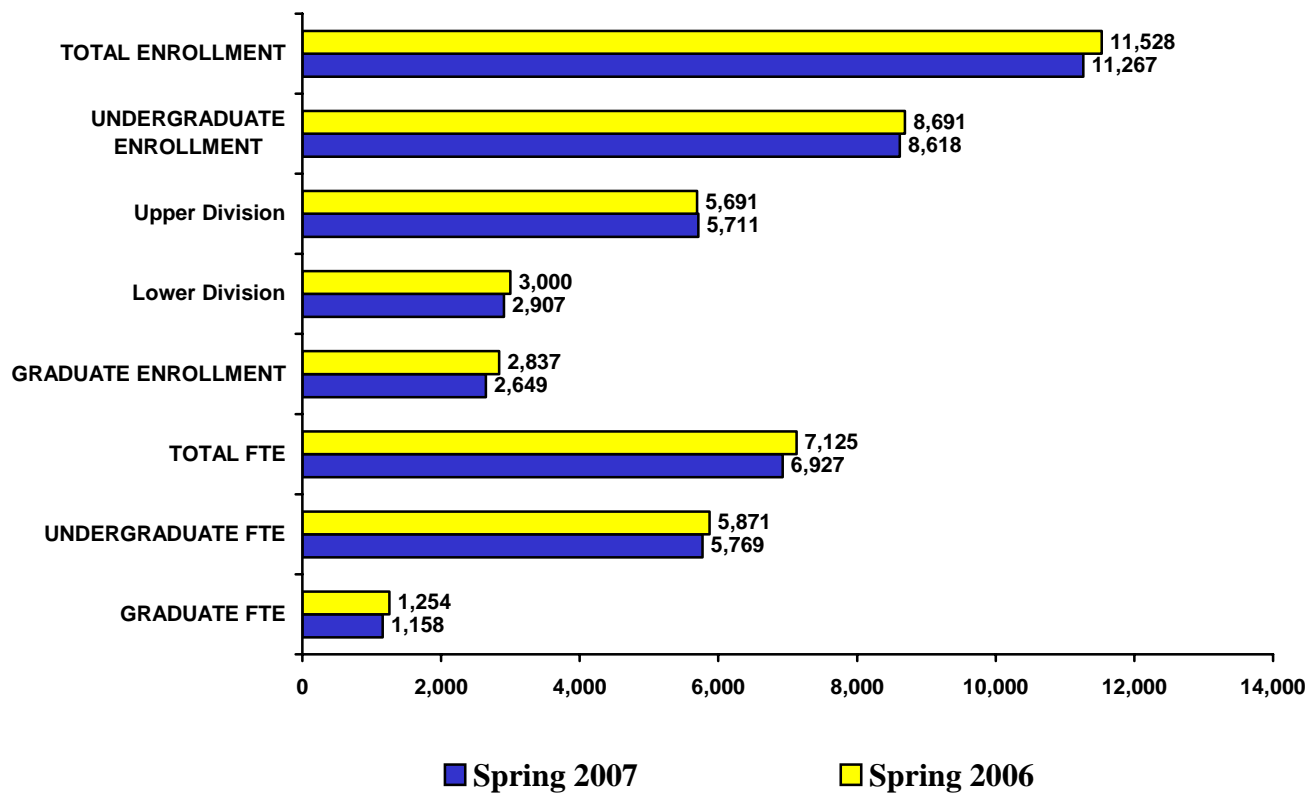


# Enrollment Fact Sheet Spring, 2007

## Comparison of Student Enrollment and FTE

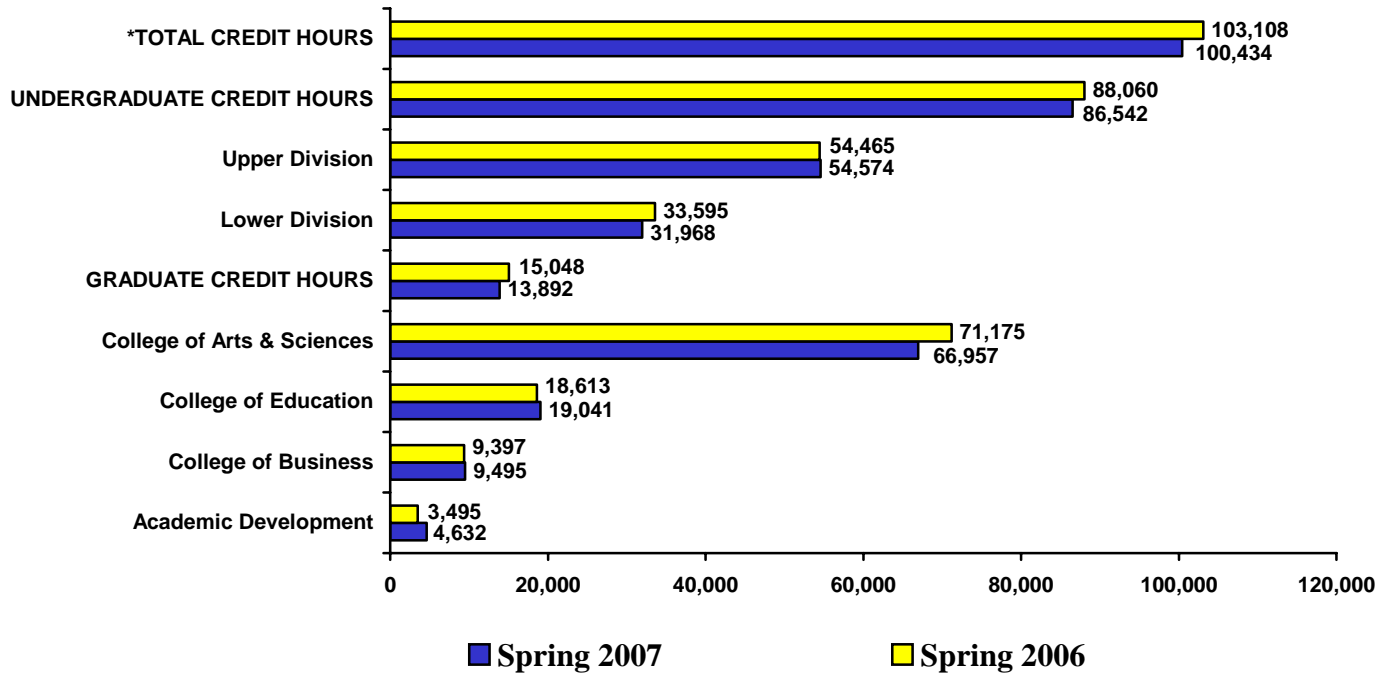


Overall enrollment for Spring, 2007 is 11,267, representing a 2.3% decrease over Spring, 2006 enrollments; student FTE declined 2.8%.

Lower division enrollments fell 3.1%, while upper division grew 0.4%, resulting in an overall decline of 0.8% at the undergraduate level.

Graduate enrollments and FTE decreased this Spring, 6.6% and 7.7%, respectively.

## Comparison of Student Credit Hours by Level and by College



\*Total Credit Hours includes Honors, NSEP, and non-traditional credit hours.

Overall student credit hours generated declined 2.6% over last spring; there was a 1.7% decrease at the undergraduate level and 7.7% at the graduate level.

The creation of a new math course in Academic Development contributed to the large increase (32.5%) in credit hours generated by that area.
