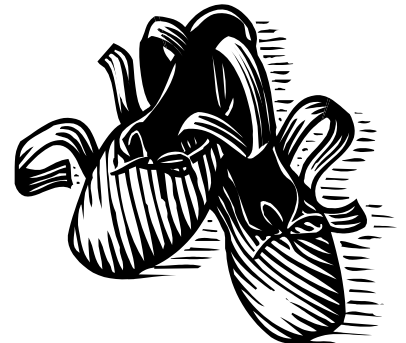

Dance Program Policies: All policies are designed to create a safe environment in which students can both learn and have fun. If you have questions regarding our policies or the dance classes, policies do not hesitate to contact our office. By registering for classes, students and parents agree to the following terms:

Registration and Attendance: Registration requires the completion of a short form for our records. Please update the registration form at the beginning of each term. Payment in full is due the first day of class. Refunds are not given after the first week of class. Missed classes may be made up during the current term. We strongly encourage students to make up missed classes. Consult with the instructor for an appropriate make up class.

Children under the age of 13 enrolled in Jazz or Hip Hop are required to be in a ballet class.

Attire: Ballet slippers and jazz shoes are required of all students. Leotards, tights, leggings, or tight fitting work out clothing are also required. No street clothing, baggy clothing allowed. Hair must be secured back from the face. No necklaces or bracelets allowed. Students not dressed appropriately will not be allowed to attend class.

No food, drink or gum allowed in the studio—except water. Cell phone usage is not allowed during class time.

Courses with less than 8 students may be cancelled

Parking permits are required to park in any lot on the NEIU campus. Daily permits for any Level II lot are available in parking lot 'H'. **Discounted permits** are available through the NEIU Dance Program.
