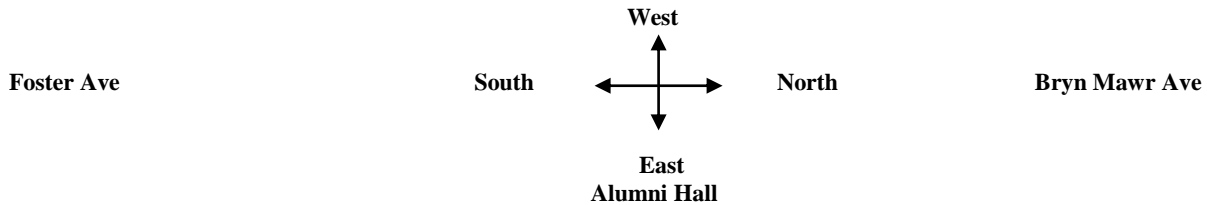

#### **Admissions, Financial Aid & Scholarships Presentation – *Golden Eagles Room***

This session will include a presentation on the admissions process, including admission criteria and important deadlines. In addition, you will learn about the various scholarship opportunities available and how to seek financial aid through various government and state programs.

#### **NEIU – El Centro Campus Presentation – *SU 216***

Northeastern Illinois University-El Centro Campus provides educational, career, and cultural opportunities primarily, though not exclusively, to the Latino community. NEIU-El Centro is located in the northwest side of Chicago, just four miles south of the Bryn Mawr campus. NEIU-El Centro makes available the general education program of the University to students who are interested in taking classes primarily during the evening hours and/or on the weekends

#### **Proyecto Pa'Lante – *SU 217***

Proyecto Pa'Lante is an educational support program designed to recruit and serve primarily Latino students who demonstrate academic potential but might not meet the requirements for general admission. After admission, the program provides support services for its students in the areas of counseling, academic advisement, tutoring, career development and cultural reinforcement. These services are designed to support their persistence in completing a Bachelor's degree.

#### **Project Success – *SU 218***

Project Success is committed to providing access and educational assistance to primarily African-American and other underrepresented students who demonstrate potential for academic success. Project Success delivers a full range of student support services including recruitment, admission, advisement, learning/study skills, and career development. This comprehensive support program serves to promote achievement toward personal excellence.
