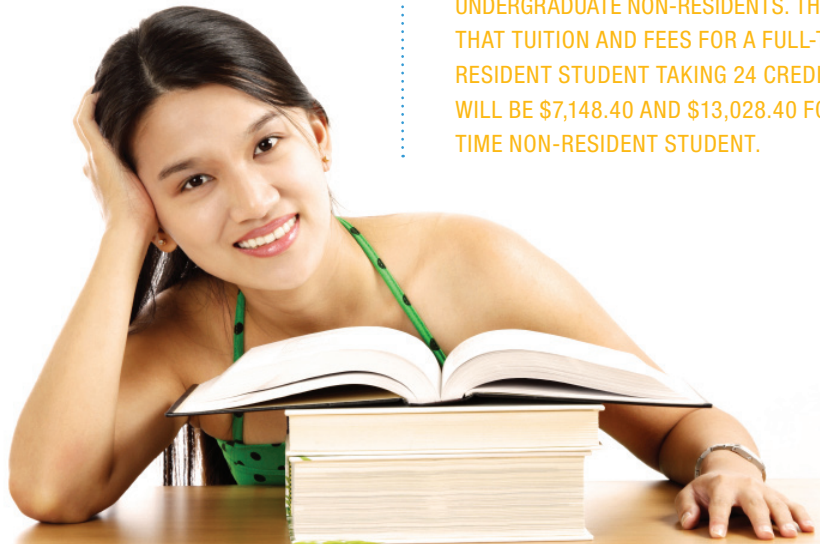
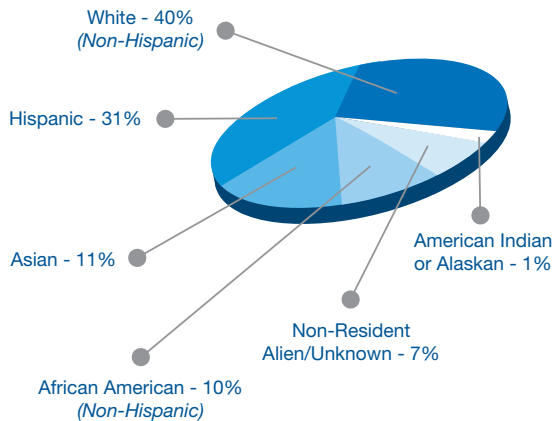
At a Glance...

- Founded in 1867 as Cook County's first teacher training school, today NEIU offers its 11,000 students more than seventy undergraduate and graduate programs in the arts, sciences, education, and business.
- The University has three Chicago locations: our Foster campus on the Northwest side, the Carruthers Center for Inner City Studies on the South side, and the El Centro Campus on the Near Northwest side. NEIU also offers courses in Lake County.

ABOUT TUITION

THE TUITION GUARANTEE RATE FOR FALL 2009 IS \$245 PER CREDIT HOUR FOR UNDERGRADUATE RESIDENTS AND \$490 PER CREDIT HOUR FOR UNDERGRADUATE NON-RESIDENTS. THIS MEANS THAT TUITION AND FEES FOR A FULL-TIME RESIDENT STUDENT TAKING 24 CREDIT HOURS WILL BE \$7,148.40 AND \$13,028.40 FOR A FULL-TIME NON-RESIDENT STUDENT.
