Undergraduates beginning Fall 2004 through Summer 2008 should refer to 'Tuition' on the NEIU Web Site ([www.neiu.edu](http://www.neiu.edu)) 'Current Students' to determine their tuition and mandatory fee cost.

- Students seeking a second bachelor's degree and graduate students-at-large will be assessed graduate level tuition.
- Undergraduate students who register for the semester following graduation may be assessed undergraduate tuition. Tuition will be recalculated when the student's status is officially updated to a graduate. This usually occurs between one and two months after the beginning of the semester. Students are responsible for paying any additional charges that may occur as a result of the change in status.
- The above table does not include miscellaneous fees as described in Table C, or, fees associated with a course.
- See Mandatory fees for a description of the fees.
- **Each semester parking is automatically charged on the student bill and is based on credit hours enrolled. Students who do not require parking must opt out by September 8, 2008.**
- Tuition and Fees are subject to change without notice.
- **The health insurance fee for Fall 2008 is to be announced.**

**On Campus Students** are Northeastern enrolled students at any one of the following sites; Main Campus (5500 N. St. Louis), El Centro (3119 N. Pulaski), the Jacob H. Carruthers' Center for Inner City Studies (700 E. Oakwood), and the Chicago Teachers' Center (770 N. Halsted). Courses taken at extension sites or off campus distance education courses are not assessed on-campus fees. A student who registers for both on-campus and extension courses will be assessed all appropriate on-campus fees.

**Residency Determination:** Evidence of resident status shall be submitted at the time of application for admission. A student may have his residency status reclassified at any time by the university on the basis of additional or changed information.

If the student is classified in error as a resident student, the change in tuition shall be

applied **to the next term after reclassification.** If the student is classified in error as a non-resident, the change in tuition shall be applicable to **the term in which the reclassification occurs.** A written claim for reconsideration must be filed within thirty calendar days from the date of assessment of tuition. For additional information refer to the current university catalog.

**Residency Status for Assessment of Tuition**

**Adult Student** (18 years or over): Must have been a bonafide resident of Illinois for a period of at least six consecutive months immediately preceding the beginning of any term of registration at the university. An adult who resides with parent(s) and has established and is maintaining a bonafide residency in Illinois will be regarded as a resident student.

**HEALTH INSURANCE FEE**

All full-time undergraduate students will automatically be covered at a cost to be announced unless they have an insurance plan equal to or better than the Northeastern student plan. The fee may be waived online at [www.chickering.com](http://www.chickering.com) by September 8, 2008. Note, the fee is not refundable after September 8, 2008.

**TRANSCRIPT FEE (6)**

Students will be assessed a \$10.00 transcript fee at the time of their first registration. This fee will allow a student to request a reasonable amount of transcripts at no additional cost.

**FRESHMAN ORIENTATION FEE (7)**

This is a mandatory one-time fee paid by freshmen who are not transferring previously earned college credit. The fee supports orientation programs for these students.

To officially drop or withdraw from any or all courses, access <http://neiuport.neiu.edu>. Failure to officially withdraw or drop classes will result in the assignment of an 'F' (failure) grade. Students who completely withdraw from all courses after the 100% credit period may still be assessed charges if they have not paid the full amount of tuition and fees.

Refunds will be processed beginning September 25, 2008 at 1:00 p.m.

**Mandatory Fees**

Mandatory fees do not apply to courses taken at extension sites or off campus Distance Education courses. However, should a student register for course work both *on campus* (as defined on the previous page) and at an extension site in the same semester, mandatory fees will apply. They are intended to enhance and facilitate many aspects of campus life to include the following:

**Academic Enhancement Fee:** This fee is dedicated to University renovation, improvement and upgrade of classrooms, laboratories and other academic space.

**Campus Recreation Fee:** This fee supports a comprehensive recreation program, including intramurals, wellness and fitness programs, aquatics, sport clubs and informal recreation.

**Clean/Renewable Energy or "Green" Fee:** The fee will fund implementation of clean and renewable energy technologies and improvement of campus energy efficiency at Northeastern Illinois University. Some examples of the uses of this fee may include: a campus-wide energy audit, lighting efficiency improvements, alternate energy sources (solar panels), and recycling initiatives

**Computer Resource Fee:** It is dedicated to the enhancement of computer services available to students. Such purposes shall include the addition of

computer workstations, additional "smart classrooms", and increased access to all the networks and communications highway currently in place as well as those to be built in the future. There will be an increased availability of staff to assist students in learning to take advantage of the new and evolving technologies.

**Health Service Fee:** The fee enables the university to provide assessment and care for a wide range of student health concerns.

**Parking Fee:** University students have three parking options: to participate in the Level II parking program, to participate in Level I parking, or to waive out of the parking program entirely. Students who choose to participate in Level II parking will be assessed the parking fee based on credit hours enrolled. For additional information see page 18.

**Performing Arts Fee:** Helps support university theatre and dance productions and musical concerts.

**Student Activity Fee:** It is used to support the Student Government, student organizations and clubs, and the many activities, programs, media, and events sponsored by the above group.

**Student Union Fee:** Helps support the Student Union, which is the heart of the activity program on-campus. It is the scene of lectures, discussions, concerts, dances, meetings, and other activities. The facilities include food services, lounges, and meeting rooms.
