Following the performance, an interactive drum and dance jam session is open to all who wish to participate.

Tuesday, December 6th, at 10 a.m. world renown artist **Kelan Phil Cohran** will warm up the space with music from the **African Diaspora** outside of Golden Eagles. At 11:30 a.m. the drum call will be made to call everyone to order.
