

Printmaking Demonstration

By Artist: Carlos Barberena



A relief print is an image created by a printmaking process where protruding surface faces of the matrix (printing plate or block) are inked; recessed areas are ink free. This demo will demonstrate how to adapt a design for relief printing, transfer the design onto the block, and cut the block with different gouges to create an enriched and balanced relief print. The demo will also demonstrate two different methods of printing: by hand using a wooden spoon on Japanese paper and printing with an etching press using BFK Rives paper.
