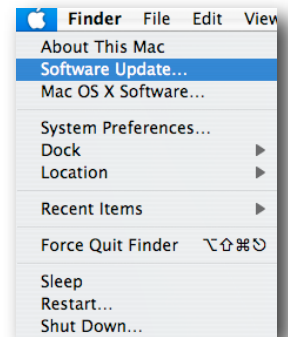


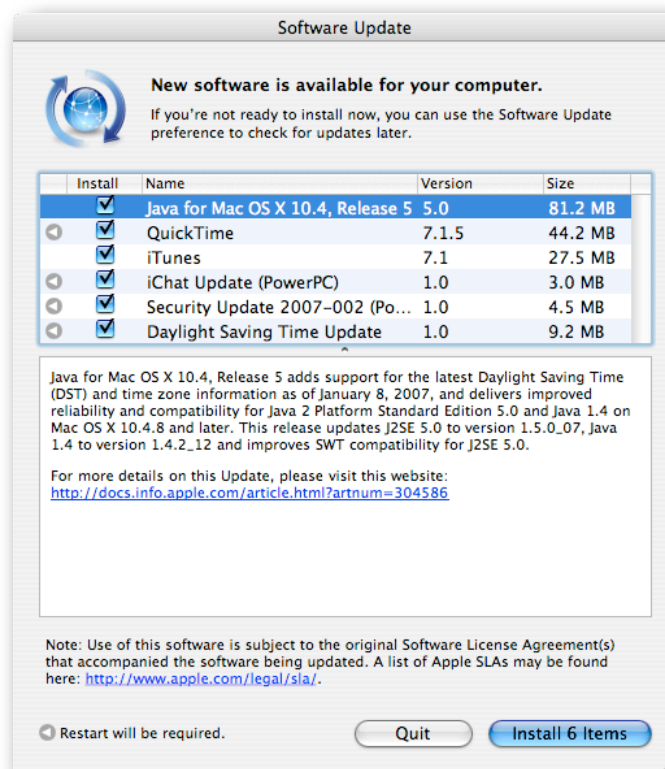
Performing Software Update on your Macintosh Computer

Keeping your Macintosh computer up to date ensures that security vulnerabilities are patched and software flaws are corrected. Your computer can be configured to perform automatic updates to the operating system and other Apple-written software through **System Preferences --> Software Update**. To perform a manual update, please follow the steps below.

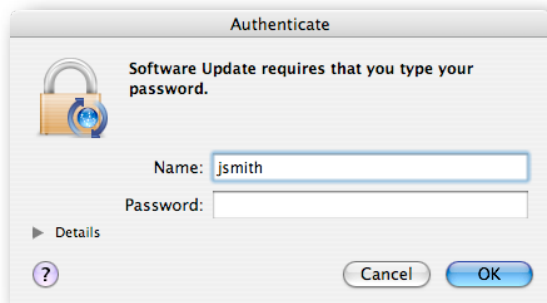
1. Click on the Apple Menu (located in the top-left corner of your screen) and select **Software Update...**. Your computer will connect to Apple via the internet and check for any available updates. This may take several seconds.



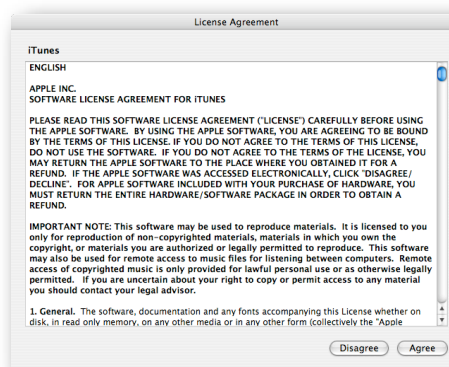
2. If any available updates are detected, a listing will appear on the screen. Select or deselect software updates by clicking within the boxes under the **Install** heading. Click on the **Install** button to begin downloading and installing the software.



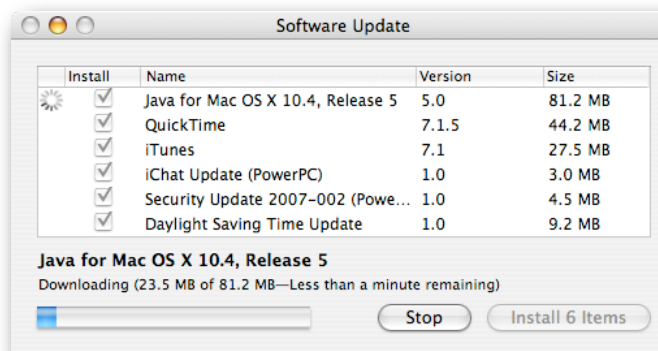
3. You will be prompted to enter your password. Please note that your password for your local computer may be different from your NEUport password.



4. A license agreement window may appear on the screen. If this happens, click on the **Agree** button to accept the license agreement.



5. Large updates and/or a slow network connection will extend the time needed to download the updates. In most cases, the update process will last several minutes.



6. After the process has completed, the computer may need to be re-started.
