EXCITING NEW DEVELOPMENTS IN NDP

This is an exciting time for Nontraditional Degree Programs (NDP). We continue our commitment to serving adult learners by developing innovative options while retaining the flexibility that has always been our hallmark.

New Name

We have revised the name of our most popular program to Bachelor of Arts in Interdisciplinary Studies (BAIS) from Board of Governors to clearly reflect the mission of the program.

New BAIS Concentrations

There are seven areas of concentration that BAIS students may pursue. They are designed to help students to frame the choices they have made regarding course of study.

The seven areas are: Fine Arts, Humanities, Natural Sciences, Social Sciences, Leadership, Community Development & Multicultural Studies, and Professional Studies.

To fulfill a concentration, students will work in consultation with a BAIS advisor to select 18 upper division hours (300-level) of course work in the relevant subjects to create an individualized group of courses that fit with the general themes of the chosen concentration.

New Nontraditional Degree Programs' Course Offerings

We have created four new courses under the NDP banner. These courses, developed for BAIS and University Without Walls (UWW) Program students, but open to all NEIU students, address University initiatives and current student needs.

300-LEVEL WRITING INTENSIVE COURSE DESIGNED FOR ADULT LEARNERS!

NDP - 310 WIP Diversity in the Workplace, 3 cr.

Workplace diversity is a hallmark of contemporary life. This course explores multiple dimensions of diversity, including race, class, gender, sexual orientation, and disabilities with the goal of preparing students to function in varied settings. The course is a writing intensive experience, offering the opportunity to develop and hone

written communication skills applicable to the workplace. Students who earn a minimum grade of C in this course will fulfill the Writing Intensive requirement.

Prereq: ENG-101 or consent of Nontraditional Degree Programs.

Joshua Thusat is the writing instructor for Nontraditional Degree Programs. He received his M.A. in English from Bowling Green State University, and he is finishing his M.A. in Linguistics at North-

eastern Illinois University this spring. Joshua notes about NDP 310: "I think students are scared of the Writing Intensive label. Although the course is intensive, the writing process is gradual. It offers students a serious and flexible space to learn about disciplinary writing. Past students will tell you they felt comfortable learning things about writing that they missed or forgot."

NONTRADITIONAL DEGREE PROGRAMS SCHOLARSHIPS

NDP students are eligible for a variety of scholarship opportunities. We encourage students to apply for:

The Brommel Mendelson-Henington Scholarship. This is a \$1,500 annual scholarship awarded to a full or part-time NDP student with a GPA of 3.0 or higher.

The Robert Pringle Memorial Scholarship for BAIS students is a \$500 scholarship awarded annually. Eligibility criteria are:

1. Admitted to BAIS, 2. in good academic standing, 3. exhibit potential to do college work, and 4. exhibit financial need.

New NEIU Tuition Scholarship for NDP Students

Applications for the Tuition Scholarship are open to any NDP student with a course load of six hours or more and a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher. Up to nine hours of tuition may be awarded on a semester basis.

NDP GRADUATE SPOTLIGHT

Recent NDP alumnus Fernando Olszanski was born in Buenos Aries, Argentina in 1965. There he completed two years at university, but quit school in order to support his family.

In 1998, Fernando decided to pursue his two passions: writing and travel and moved to Chicago with his family. After more travel to Japan, Fer-

nando moved back to Chicago and became a writer and community advocate with *ContraTiempo* magazine.

In the BOG program (now BAIS), Fernando took advantage of the portfolio option, documenting his life-learning and proving its equivalence to college coursework. His is one of the most successful portfolios in the program's history; he

earned 55 credit hours.

Fernando has this to say about the BAIS program:

"What I liked the most about the program was that I had the chance to review my life experience, and see it in a different perspective as if every experience were a brick in a wall." Fernando graduated in August 2009.
