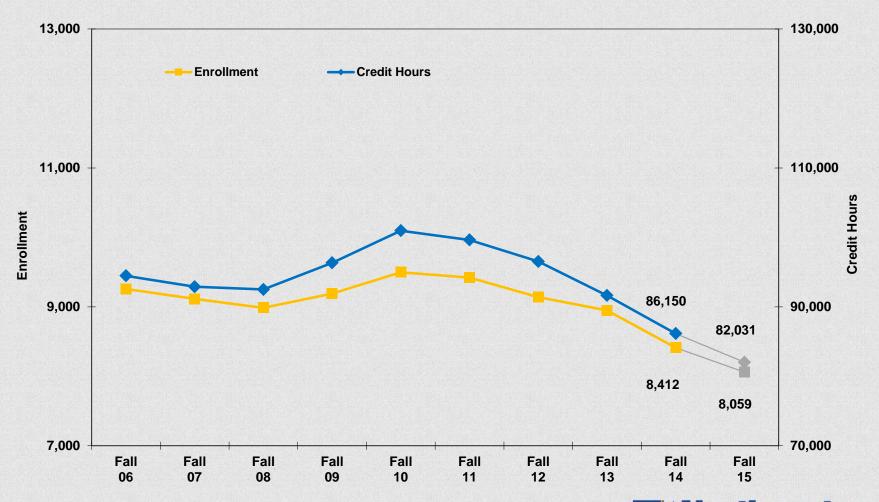

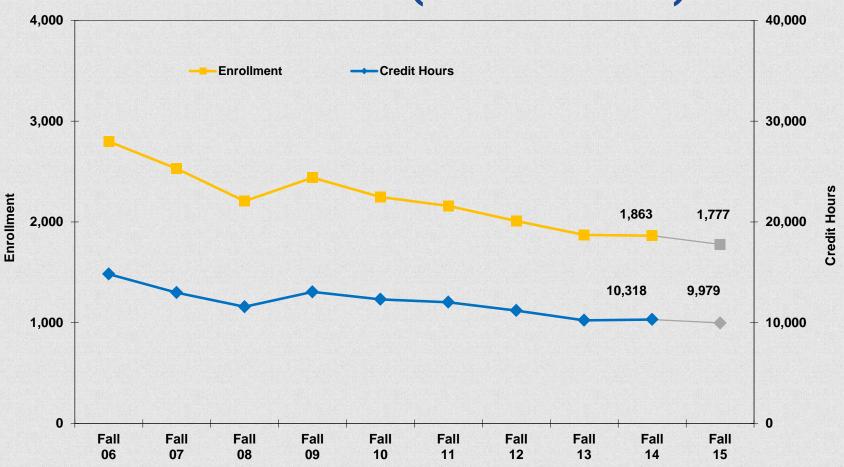


Undergraduate Enrollment and Credit Hours (2006 to 2015)



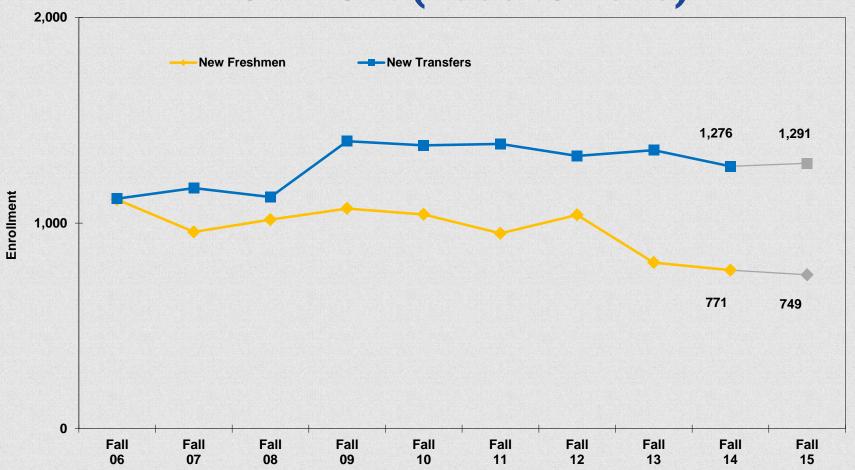


Graduate Enrollment and Credit Hours (2006 to 2015)



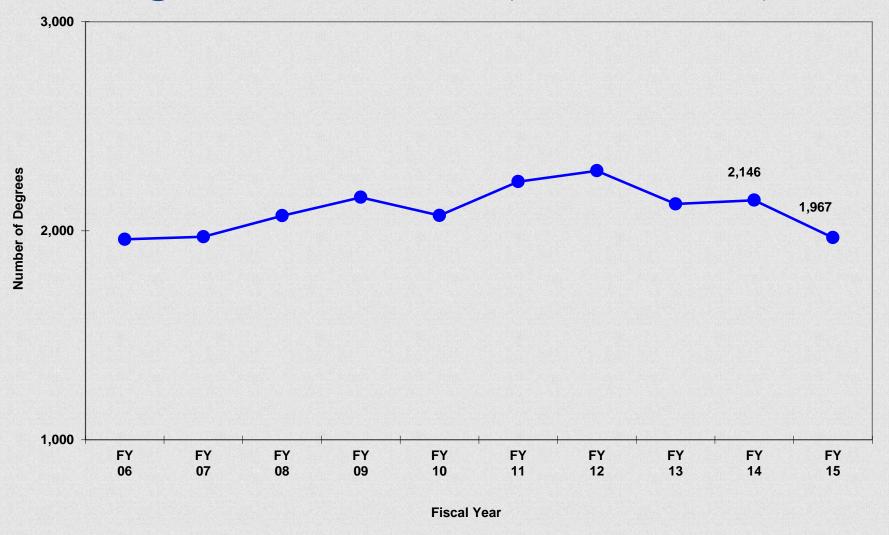


New Freshmen and New Transfers Enrollment (2006 to 2015)



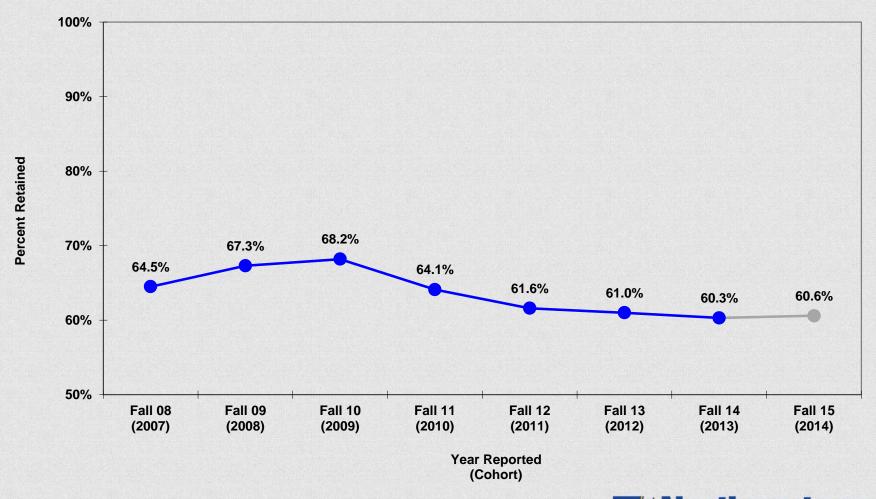


Degrees Conferred (2006 to 2015)

Budget Reduction Process

- March 3 Open Budget Forum
- Vice Presidential areas assignments
- Brown bag discussions
- Weekly budget meetings with UPBC Chair
- April 21 Academic Affairs Town Hall
- Four groups of potential cuts



Budget Reductions

- 1. Cuts to non-personnel expenses (i.e., equipment and commodities)
- 2. Cuts to vacant positions
- 3. Cuts to filled non-instructional positions
- 4. Cuts to instruction



Budget Reduction Process

- May 6 Budget update
- May 8 Vice Presidents presentation to the UPBC
- June 18 Board of Trustees approved preliminary FY2016 operating budget that includes 3 groups of cuts, not instruction.





Board Resolution

Whereas, the Board of Trustees of Northeastern Illinois University expresses its concern that the State of Illinois has not appropriated a fiscal year 2016 budget; and

Whereas, the Board wishes to express its deep concern for our students and for the future of the state;

Now therefore be it resolved that the Board of Trustees of Northeastern Illinois University encourages an adequate and timely solution to the budget crisis that reflects an appropriation to support a quality education for the students of Northeastern Illinois University.

Approved and adopted by the President and Board of Trustees of Northeastern Illinois University this 17th day of September, 2015.

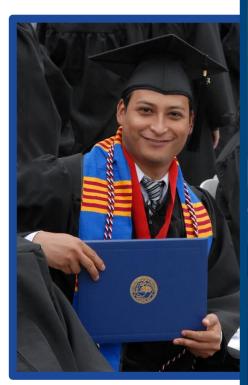
