Dr. Speight has been a faculty member at Loyola since 1991. She received her Ph.D. in Counseling Psychology from The Ohio State University in 1990.

Dr. Speight teaches courses such as: Multicultural Counseling, Ethics and Legal Issues in Counseling Psychology, Identity and Pluralism, Psychology of Oppression and Liberation, and Professional Issues for Counselors.

Her scholarly interests include: multicultural competence and social justice, African American women and mental health, the psychological impact of oppression, African centered psychology, suicide in the African American community, and identity development issues.
