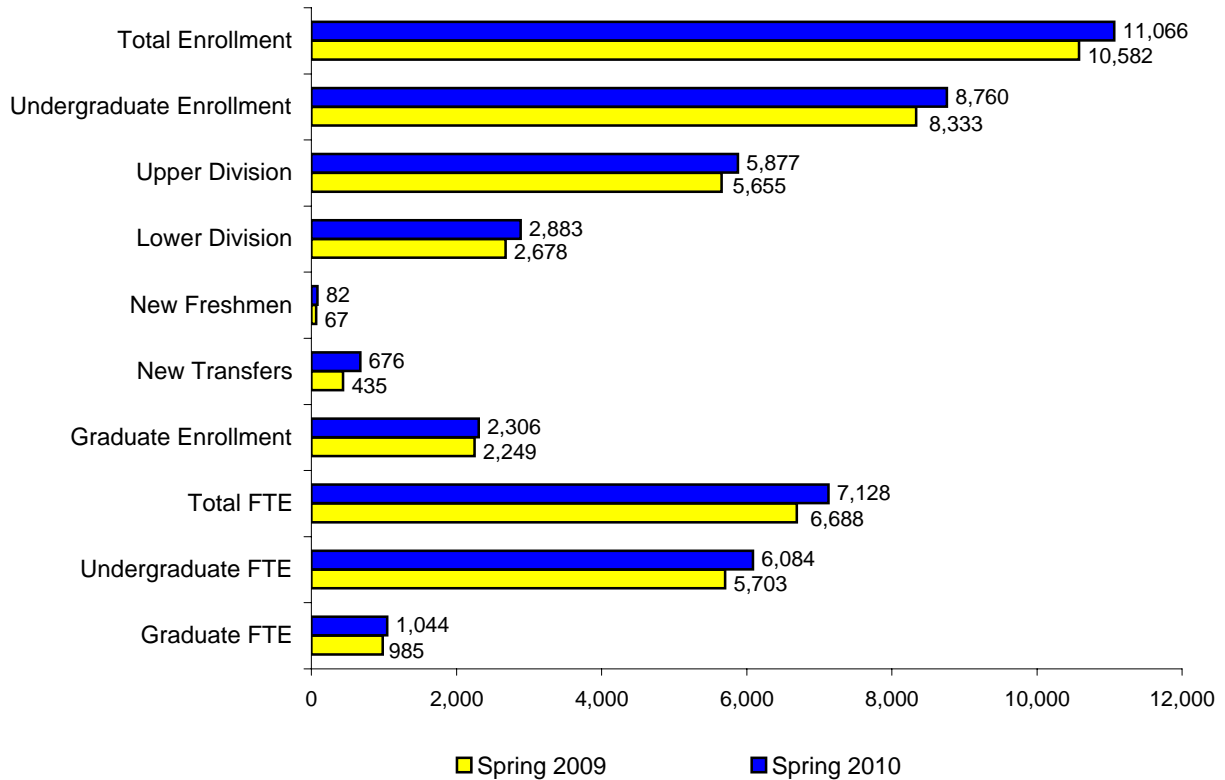

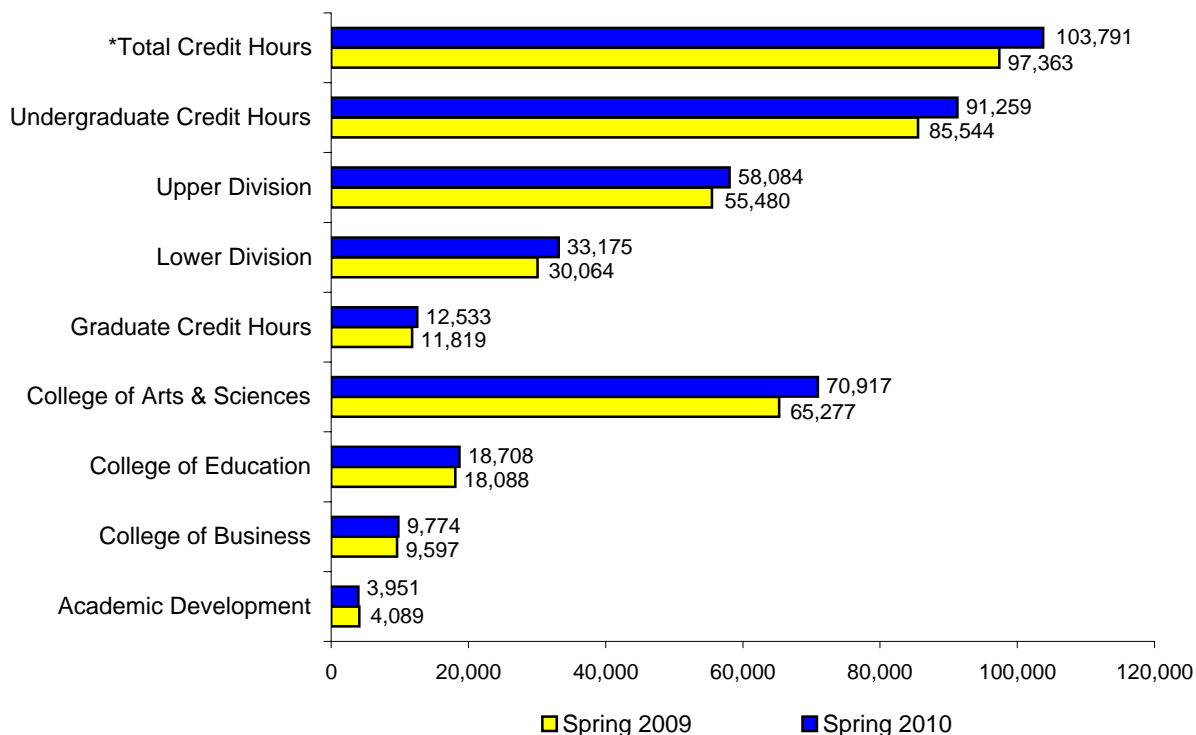

Student Enrollment and FTE



- ❖ Total enrollment for Spring 2010 was 11,066. This represents a 4.6% increase from the prior spring; total FTE also increased by 6.6%.
- ❖ Undergraduate enrollment showed an increase of 5.1% and an increase of 6.7% in FTE.
- ❖ New transfer enrollment increased by 55.4%
- ❖ Spring 2010 showed an increase of 2.5% for graduate enrollment and a greater increase in graduate FTE, up 6.0% from Spring 2010.

Student Hours by Level and by College



*Total Credit Hours includes Honors, NSEP, and non-traditional credit hours.

- ❖ Total credit hours generated during the Spring 2010 session increased from the prior spring by 6.6%.
- ❖ Undergraduate credit hours also increased by 6.7%. A drill down shows that this overall increase was higher in the lower level (10.3%) than the upper level (4.7%). For the Graduate College credit hours were up by 6%, from 11,819 to 12,533.
- ❖ Among the colleges, student hours from Spring 2009 to Spring 2010 increased 1.8% for Business, 3.4% for Education, and 8.6% for Arts and Science and decreased by 3.4% for Academic Development.
