I am a third-year graduate student in the Clinical Psychology Ph.D. program at Oklahoma State University. My current research examines the relationship between negative life events and suicide ideation, and if optimism can help moderate that relationship in African Americans.

How did NEIU prepare you for your professional journey?

NEIU has helped me to think big and finish strong, but the immense support from faculty in the Psychology Department has allowed me to strengthen my research skills significantly. Additionally, the classes at NEIU challenged me to think critically in science in building a strong foundation for success in research. I was also guided in peer mentorship with faculty support while applying for graduate programs. Dr. Rueckert always took time out her day whenever I had questions regarding graduate school and figuring out which programs were best tailored to fit my research interests.

What advice would you give to undergraduate students?

I would tell current NEIU Psychology students to not give up regardless of the obstacles and feats faced while making your dreams a reality. There are going to be people that doubt you, and sometimes you are only given a small chance to succeed, but you must make the best of what you have and make every opportunity count. It is best to start early as possible; working in research labs and clinical settings to gain valuable experience. Thus, allowing your application to stand out from the rest, as applying to graduate programs can be a very competitive process; especially at the Ph.D. level, with most programs at an admittance rate of less than 12 percent.


3. What is your proudest accomplishment?






