Economics Minor Requirements (six courses, 18 credits):

ECON 215 (Principles of Macroeconomics)Any three 300-level elective coursesECON 217 (Principles of Microeconomics)(nine credits) in Economics. These have ECONECON 220 (Business and Economics Statistics)*215 and 217 as prerequisites.

Financial Economics Track:

ECON 215, 217; 220; three of ECON 307, 321, 344, 345, 343, 318

Applied Data Analysis Track:

ECON 215, 217, 220; three of ECON 318, 343, 346, 349, 310

Policy Track: Urban Economics:

ECON 215, 217; 220 or 320 (WIP), three of ECON 333, 334, 309, 330

Policy Track: Economic Issues and Public Health:

ECON 215, 217; 220, 320 (WIP) or 323 (WIP); three of ECON 306, 322, 336, 337, 349
