Furthermore, the candidate will be committed to reflective, collaborative, and transformative practice.

University and College Background:

Founded in 1867, Northeastern Illinois University (NEIU) enrolls about 5,700 students and is regarded as one of the most diverse public comprehensive universities in the Midwest. The Main Campus is located on 67 acres in a residential area on the Northwest Side of Chicago and two additional campuses are located in the Avondale and Bronzeville neighborhoods of Chicago. Since 1997, the U.S. Department of Education has designated NEIU a Hispanic-Serving Institution. - Professional LCPC/LMFT licensure or eligibility for licensure in the state of Illinois
- Evidence of research and scholarship productivity
- Previous Couple and Family and Clinical Mental Health counseling experience

Preferred Qualifications:

- Acquired LCPC or LMFT licensure in the state of Illinois
- Completion of a Certificate in Couple and Family Counseling if not having graduated from a CFC program
- Evidence of teaching effectiveness and ability to teach across core counseling courses
- Experience providing clinical supervision in an academic setting
- Demonstrated experience working with diverse individuals in teaching, counseling, and supervision
- Membership and involvement in professional organizations such as ACA, AAMFT, or ACES
- Experience advising graduate students
- Knowledge of CACREP-accreditation process
