Social Work Program Description

The Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) degree in Social Work is accredited by the [Council on Social Work Education \(CSWE\)](#) and designed to prepare beginning level generalist social work practitioners who are committed to the values and ethics of the profession and the provision of quality services to diverse clients. Coursework and field experiences expose students to a variety of social work settings and clients who represent diverse socio-cultural backgrounds.

Students who earn their BSW can transition into the Advanced Standing Master of Social Work (MSW) program to earn their MSW in one year if attending full-time or two years if attending part-time.

Admission Requirements

- Students must have earned a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher for all college or university course work attempted. Students must be in good academic standing at the last college or university attended.
- Required documents are: application for admission, \$30 nonrefundable application fee, and official transcripts from all colleges and universities.

General Education Requirements

- **Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree:** Students who transfer with an approved Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) Model Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have met Northeastern Illinois University's General Education requirements. ***Note** – If you are planning on pursuing a graduate degree in Social Work upon completion of your BSW, you are advised to successfully complete a statistics course. This is a requirement of most MSW programs. You can do this at City Colleges of Chicago by completing MATH 125 Introductory Statistics.

- MATH 125 should be completed if the student wishes to pursue a Master's Degree in Social Work, as most Social Work Master's Degree programs require a statistics course.
- Students pursuing a Master's Degree in Social Work need to maintain a 3.0 overall GPA.

Advanced Standing Master of Social Work (MSW)

Students admitted to the MSW Program who have earned a Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) degree in the past five years from a college or university accredited by the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE) can immediately transition into the 30 credit-hour Specialized Curriculum. This curriculum can be completed in one year full-time or two years part-time.

Admission requirements to the program are as follows:

- Official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended
- A two-page professional statement addressing your goals and objectives specific to the MSW program
- Undergraduate GPA of 3.25 or higher
- Three letters of recommendation with one letter coming from the BSW Program Director, Field Director, or a faculty member of the school from which you received your BSW
