The Robertson Family Education Enrichment Award

Purpose:

The goal of the endowed scholarship will be to support students having unmet financial need of Black/African American and Latinx/Hispanic race/ethnicity at Northeastern Illinois University who have demonstrated courageous resilience in his/hers/their personal narrative. The award may be used to underwrite expenses of tuition, books, fees, or personal expenses.

Eligibility Requirements:

- o Must complete the Application
- o Must schedule and complete the mentee interview
- o Minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average
- o Open to any major
- o Must present a letter of support from faculty member
- o First preference shall go to applicants who are African American; if there is no African American student that qualifies, a Latinx/Hispanic student

Scholarship Requirements:

- o Meet four times (in-person or via internet) with mentor during the semester (16 weeks)
- o Work with mentor on final reflection assignment that summarizes the experience
- o Submit final evaluation
- o (Optional) participate in 'informational interviews', mutually arranged by the alumni mentor and mentee, with an external third party

Award amount:

o A maximum of two scholarships are awarded per academic year – one per semester. Award amount is subject to change pending applicant pool and eligibility. Award given out in two installments during the semester based upon engagement in the program.

Application Submission Deadline:

O The application deadline for Fall 2024 is September 1, 2024. The application deadline for Spring 2025 is December 1, 2024.
