Updates from Academic Affairs: Interim Provost Shayne Cofer

1. Report from the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) multi-location visit

NEIU completed a peer reviewer visit in March 2026 to its additional locations at University Center of Lake County (UCLC); El Centro and Carruthers Center (virtual). In April 2026, NEIU received a positive report on this visit from HLC.

“Visits to each of these locations demonstrated the diversity of services provided to meet the needs of the diverse NEIU learner and the communities the university serves. NEIU is to be commended for its use of these locations to embrace the needs of the communities that showed up to the sessions (the first two in the pouring rain) to tell the story of how much NEIU has improved their lives.”

“The locations visited for NEIU demonstrate compliance with all of the required elements to the highest level.”

Academic Affairs is particularly appreciative of the directors and staff at these locations, and the faculty and chairs that teach there, for the hard work and engagement with the HLC peer reviewer visits.

2. Update on consolidation and redesign of BA in Geography and Environmental Studies and B.S. in Applied Geosciences

In AY 2023-24 Academic Affairs paused admissions to the B.S. in Earth Science due to low enrollment and asked the Earth Science, Geography and Environmental Studies programs to look into consolidation.

Following a redesign, the three distinct bachelor's degree programs resulted in two distinct programs with two concentrations each.

- B.A. in Geography and Environmental Studies, with two concentrations: Geography concentration and Environmental Studies concentration
- B.S. in Applied Geosciences with two concentrations: Geodata and Geospatial Analysis concentration and Earth Ecosystem Resource Management concentration

Awaiting IBHE approval of our request of a Reasonable Modification and Extension (RME).

Headcount

Fall 2026 undergraduate headcount is currently up by 34 students, reflecting a current enrollment gain of 17.7%

Fall 2026 graduate headcount is currently up by 25 students, reflecting a gain of 24.8%

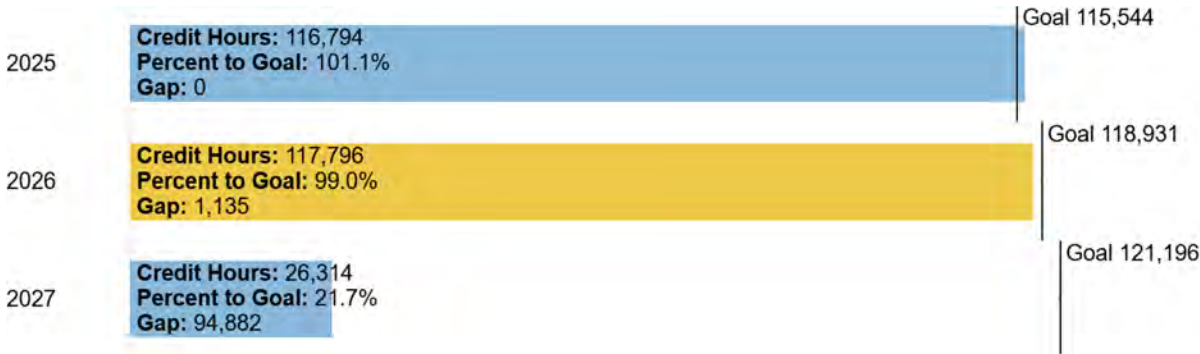
Both enrollment gains reflect earlier onboarding experiences by undergraduate freshmen and graduate students. Transfer students are currently lagging behind in registration however have an 18.7% increase in Intents To Enroll (ITE's on May 6)

Credit Hours

Summer credit hours total 10,839.0, down -453.0 compared to this time last year (-4.2% YOY)

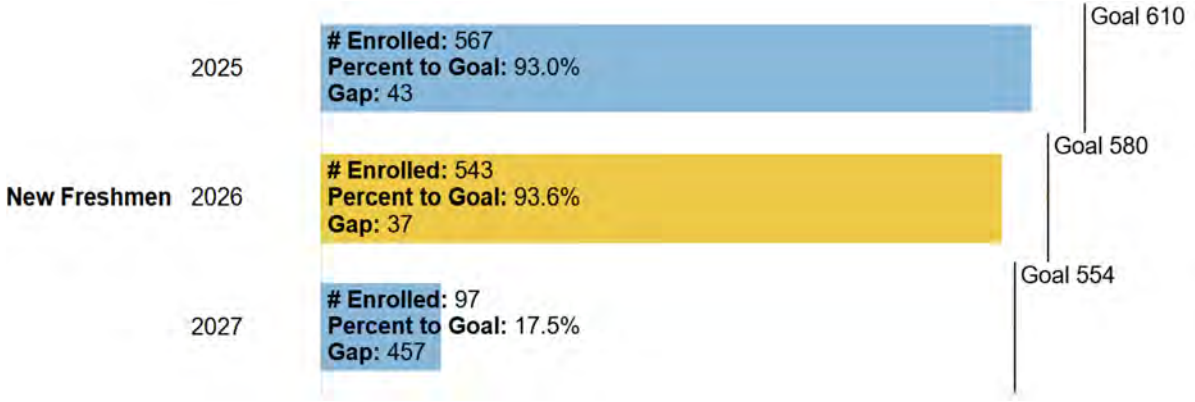

Enrollment Summary- Credit Hours



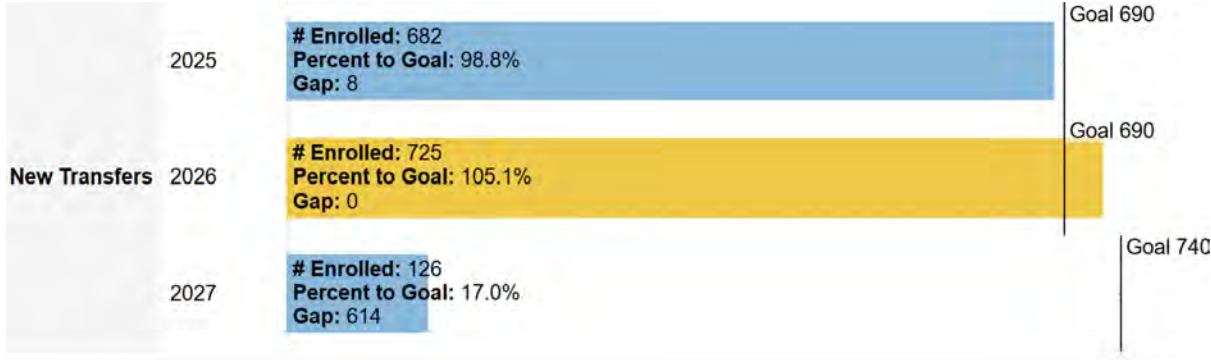

Enrollment Summary- Freshmen



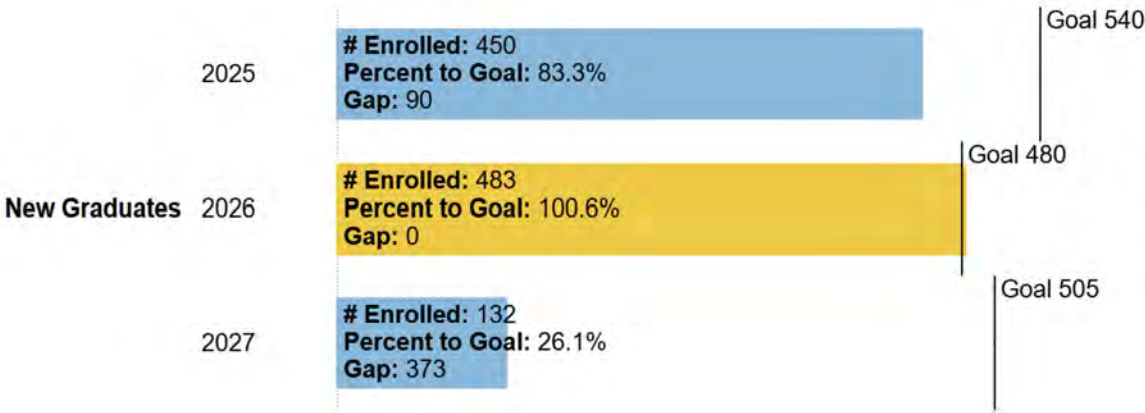

Enrollment Summary- International

International applicants show a continued decrease in applicants and admitted students. The federal landscape has made it difficult to recruit international students, which typically comprise of 3% of NEIU’s population. In addition, we have increased our review of approved recruitment agents, which has resulted in a reduction of approved international agents, consequently impacting a reduction of applicants overall.

As of today, we are experiencing a 31% decrease in admitted students.

 - Initial debt: \$1.4M, 358 students
 - 5/1/26 - 49% reduction, \$710K recovered
- NEIUSar Progress Survey results and continued effort to increase faculty participation

- Attendance Survey 39.3% completion
- Progress Survey 1 55.8% completion

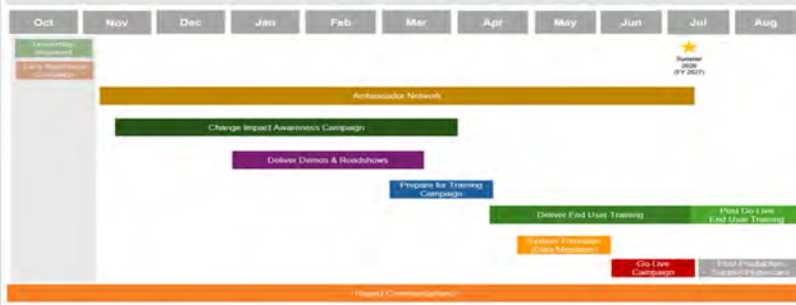

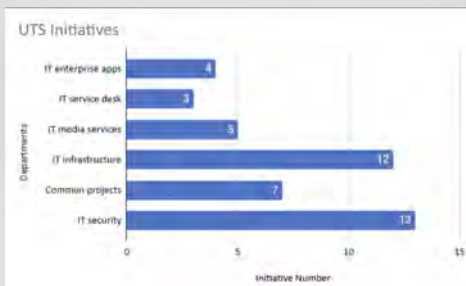
