


A Message from the Director



El Centro was very busy during the fall semester. From Pasadena, California to Atlanta, Georgia, El Centro is spreading the word about all the great work Northeastern does to support its students.

In October, El Centro participated in three major STEM events. To start, Google visited Northeastern's Main and El Centro locations to recruit students for internships and employment opportunities. Then, El Centro had the pleasure of welcoming over 100 high school students from the Chicago Public Schools for AT&T's HACEMOS 20th Annual International High Technology Day, exposing them to educational and career opportunities in STEM. It was especially exciting for Northeastern to sponsor ten STEM students at this year's Hispanic Engineer National Achievement Awards Conference (HENAAC) in Pasadena, California, where they received training in Applied Cryptography, Penetration Testing, and Digital Forensics. Congratulations to Beth McDonald and John Crissman, two of NEIU's computer science graduate students, for winning 2nd prize at the Data Analytics Competition.

Providing STEM opportunities is not the only way El Centro supports its students. To continue to do great things, our students also need financial support. On Saturday, October 6, in collaboration with the Office of Financial Aid, El Centro hosted a FAFSA workshop which assisted 55 students and their families in completing their FAFSA application.

The same weekend, El Centro team members, Rebeca Lamadrid-Quevedo, assistant director, and Mimi Crespo, coordinator of the Learning Resource Center, presented at this year's Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities (HACU) national conference in Atlanta, Georgia, where they showcased El Centro's Scholars Program, a comprehensive support program for first-year students.

Diana Redkva understands the power of an education. With her parents and brother cheering her on, Diana is not afraid to pursue her dream of achieving an accounting degree.

Diana was first introduced to the field of accounting in her freshman year at Schurz High School. Every year after that she enrolled in an accounting class. During her senior year, Diana experienced first-hand how to run her own virtual business, using an online accounting program. She says that "running a business is very complicated, but I enjoy juggling numbers and balancing accounts."

When it came time to apply for college, Diana was not sure which college to choose. Diana's brother advised her to attend Northeastern because "it has a really great business school." Diana followed her big brother's advice and, in August 2017, enrolled in El Centro's cohort program. She said that her "experience in the cohort program was amazing. I loved the workshops. With her mother's wise words guiding her, Diana reached out and asked for a position at El Centro. Impressed by her determination, Dr. Maria Luna-Duarte, director of El Centro, offered her a position as a student worker. For the past year, "Diana has been a pleasure to work with at El Centro. With her strong work ethic, professional attitude, and friendly demeanor, Diana is truly an asset to El Centro," said Luna-Duarte.

Looking back on all she has accomplished since arriving from Ukraine as a 10-year-old girl -- learning English as a Second Language, navigating a new school system, passing the Constitution test for U.S. citizenship -- Diana never dreamed she would be living in Chicago studying accounting at Northeastern. NEIU El Centro's New Recruiter Denise Roman



NEIU students, Aleksei Aguirre, Erik Macias, Rudy Pichola, Beth McDonald, John Crissman, Marianela Mendoza, Marco Cortes, Luis Sanchez, Jose Lopez, and Pedro Gutierrez, worked diligently with Dr. Perera for several months to prepare for this conference. Students competed in several competitions, including an online virtual security contest, the Cyber Security Hack-a-Thon, and the Data Analytics Competition, where two of Northeastern's computer science graduate students, Beth McDonald and John Crissman, received 2nd prize. To prepare for these competitions, students received

training in Applied Cryptography, Penetration Testing, and Digital Forensics.

Dr. Perera, one of NEIU's computer science professors, who has been working closely with students at El Centro for the past four years, strongly believes in building students' confidence by immersing students in the field of computer science. Every year Dr. Perera works together with NEIU staff, faculty and students to bring these opportunities to Northeastern. Dr. Perera is quick to point out that "these initiatives are a collaborative effort. We work together as a community to support our students."

Because of her expertise in advising students and event planning, El Centro's own Financial Aid Coordinator, Karim Escobar-Franklin, was invited to attend the conference, organizing students and assisting with registration. This trip was also made possible because of a National Science Foundation (NSF) grant and our partnership with the Computing Alliance for Hispanic Serving Institutions (CAHSI), in which NEIU has been an active member since 2013.
