No appointment needed, you can pay us a visit, give us a call, or send us an email. Please take notice of the NEIU portal. The portal is our means of conveying information to you. If you have already been awarded financial aid you can see your package under "Financial Aid Awards". If you have not been awarded, you can check if we still need something from you under "Financial Aid Requirements". The requirements will have "red flags" that you can select to get additional information regarding that requirement. Once you have met all the requirements, we can then review your file

so that you can be awarded. Once you have been awarded, you can see if you need additional help in the form of loans. Please understand that if you intend on using Federal Direct Loans to assist you with your expenses, you must complete Direct Loans Entrance Counseling, and the Master Promissory Note online at www.studentloans.gov. You also need to turn in a signed loan request form to the Financial Aid Office. If you never had a student loan before, come in and see us. We can help you understand how much you may need after reviewing your aid package. If you are unsure or do not understand your financial aid and how you will be paying for this school year, do not hesitate to reach out to us. Remember, we are here for you! Take the time to check your portal, review your awards and/or requirements, review your charges and understand where you stand for the award year. The rest of the school year will be much more enjoyable and stress-free once you already have your financial aid in order and a sound plan to have your tuition and fees covered. This will make it easier for you to concentrate on what brought you to our university: your education.

#EARLYFAFSA

Starting October 1st, you can Submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid for the 2020-2021 academic year. To maximize your financial aid eligibility, you must complete your FAFSA as early as possible.

There are deadlines for eligibility to receive Illinois MAP Grant, FSEOG (Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant) and Federal Work-Study. The Illinois Map grant can pay as much as \$5,340 a year of free money in addition to your other awards.

The act provides that "a student who is an Illinois resident and who is not eligible for federal financial aid, including, but not limited to, a transgender student who is disqualified for failure to register for selective service or a noncitizen student who has not obtained lawful permanent residence, shall be eligible for state financial aid benefits...".
