These materials are also available online using the CAN-8 client Windows application in the lab or off-campus. Some material can be duplicated if students supply new and unused cassettes, CD-R disks, DVD-R disks or a USB flash drive with enough space for the desired lessons. 				
IMPORTANT RULES, REGULATIONS & LAB USE POLICIES	 FOOD AND DRINKS ARE FORBIDDEN IN THE LAB! UNO EXCEPTIONSU! Workstations, and help from lab staff is available on a first-come-first-served basis. Students enrolled in World Languages and Cultures courses are given priority for lab use. Downloading, installing software and tampering with computers is forbidden. Non-academic computer use is forbidden such as; chat, social networking, videos and games. Excessive printing is not allowed; the print management system allows a per semester quota. The print release stations are located anywhere on campus and can print documents from the lab. CDs or USB drives are required to save documents. Hard drives are automatically cleaned and all saved files are automatically removed with each computer reboot. An NEIU ID Card is required to use the lab's CD-ROMs, DVDs, VHS cassettes, and books, and these materials may not be removed from the lab or Library. Cell phones must be turned off to not disturb students while studying and recording speech. The WL&C Department is not responsible for loss of personal property left behind. When leaving, quit software, push in chairs, hang up headphones and keep the lab clean for others. 				
ASSIGNMENTS & LAB ATTENDANCE	Lab use is part of homework assignments for General Education WL&C courses in order for students to effectively learn a new language and culture. These assignments may require using audiovisual and computer material at the lab, and vary with course syllabus and instructor's objectives. CAN-8, other Internet software, and textbook specific websites have built-in electronic methods to track students' attendance, program usage and answers.
