
Enrollment Fact Sheet Fall, 2010 Office of Institutional Research




Total enrollment for Fall 2010 is 11,746. This represents a 1.0% increase from the prior fall; total FTE also increased by 3.3%.

Undergraduate enrollment showed an increase of 3.3% and an increase of 4.8% in FTE.

New freshmen decreased by 2.7% and new transfers also decreased by 1.4%,

Fall 2010 showed a significant drop of 7.8% for graduate enrollment and also decreased in graduate FTE, down 5.6% from Fall 2009.



*Total Credit Hours includes Honors, NSEP, and non-traditional credit hours.

Total credit hours generated during Fall 2010 increased from the prior fall by 3.6%.

Undergraduate credit hours also increased by 4.8% A drill down shows that this overall increase was distributed equally between lower level and upper level. For the Graduate College, credit hours were down by 5.6%, from 13,054 to 12,322.

Among the colleges, student hours from Fall 2009 to Fall 2010 were flat for Education and Business, but increased 5.0% for Arts and Science and 5.6% for Academic Development.
