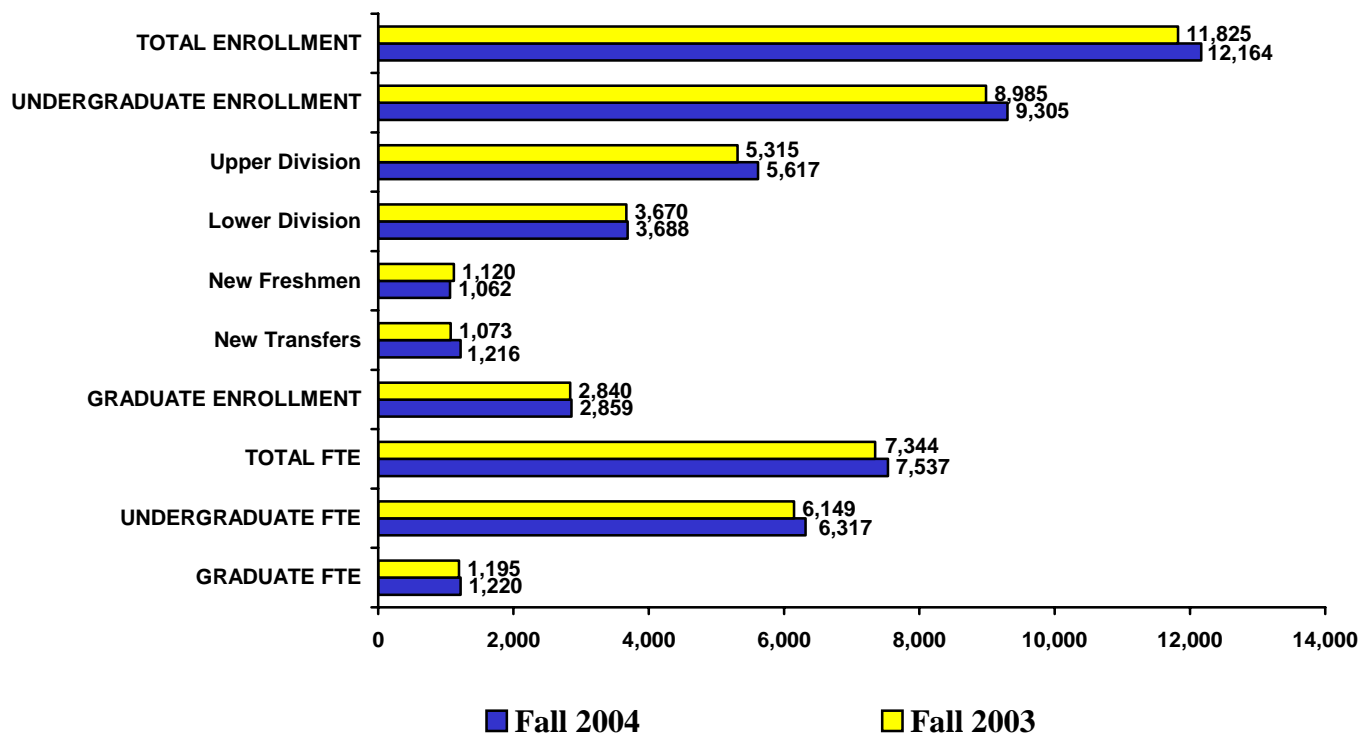

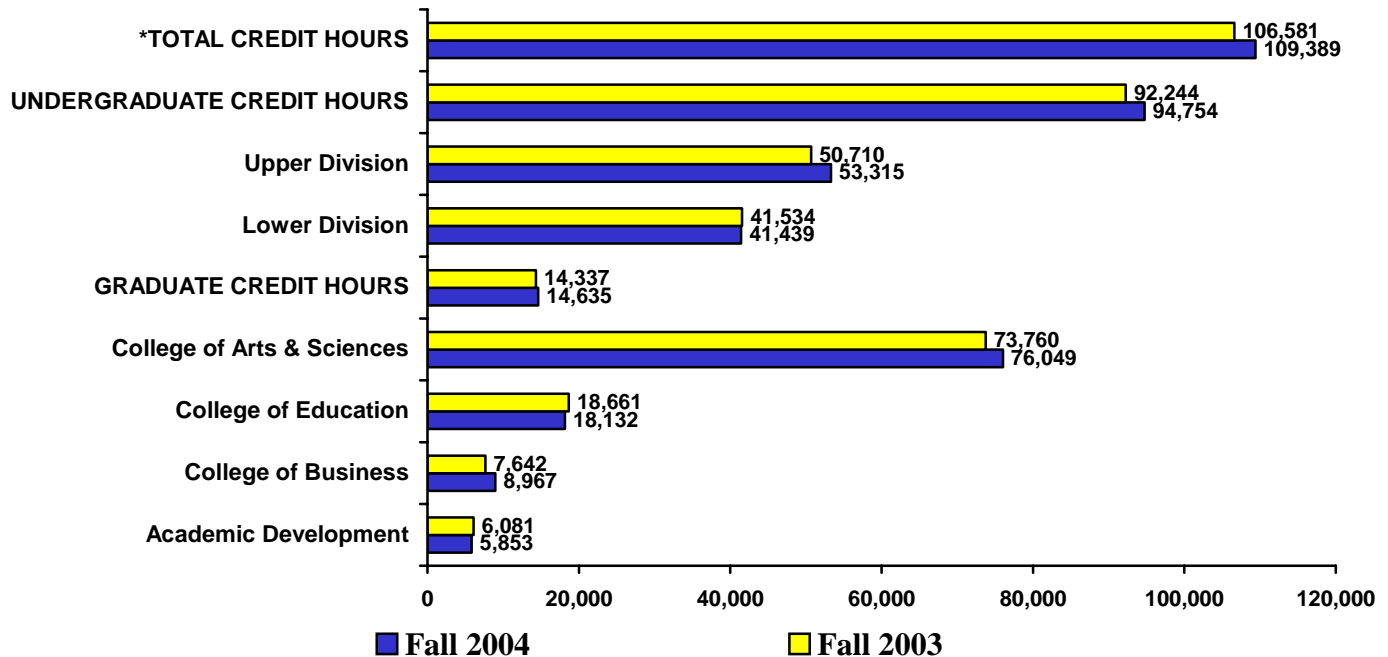

Comparison of Student Enrollment and FTE



- In Fall, 2004 overall enrollment and student FTE *increased* by 2.9% and 2.6%, respectively.
- Other notable enrollment changes for this fall:
 - Undergraduate enrollment *increased* by 3.6%
 - The number of juniors and seniors enrolled *increased* by 5.2%
 - New freshmen enrollment *decreased* by 5.2%
 - New transfer student enrollment *increased* by 13.3%

Comparison of Student Credit Hours by Level and by College



Total Credit Hours includes Honors, NSEP, and non-traditional credit hours

- A 2.6% *increase* in student credit hours was generated by Fall 2004 enrollments.
- The College of Business and Management realized a 17.3% *increase* in student credit hours from fall enrollments.

Changes in the Fall, 2004 Student Profile:

- Compared with last year, there was a small *decrease* in the percent of new freshmen enrolled full-time.
- In this fall's new freshman class, African-American and Asian students made up a slightly higher percent of the population, while the percent of Hispanic students *decreased* slightly.
