



Comparison of Student Enrollment and FTE



- Total enrollment in fall, 2007 decreased 3.4%; at the undergraduate level enrollment fell by 1.5% and at the graduate level there was a 9.6% decline in enrollments.
- Among the newly enrolled undergraduates this fall, new transfer enrollments increased 4.6%, while the number of new freshmen students decreased 14.1%. Total student FTE also experienced a modest decrease of 3.4%.

Comparison of Student Credit Hours by Level and by College

- Total credit hour productivity slightly decreased this fall by 3.1%. The largest decrease was in graduate credit hours which fell 12.4%. Among the three colleges, the College of Business and Management was the only college to experience an increase in credit hours generated (2.7%).
- Compared with last fall, the student profile has changed very little. Nine out of ten new freshmen and nearly six out of ten new transfer students are enrolled full-time. Members of underrepresented groups make up 60% of the new freshmen cohort and nearly 40% of new transfer students.
