



Enrollment Fact Sheet Spring, 2011 Office of Institutional Research



- ❖ Total headcount enrollment in Spring 2011 is 11,166 students, representing nearly 1 percent increase from the previous spring term. Total FTE enrollment increased by 1.1 percent.
- Undergraduate enrollment totals 8,940 students, up 2.1 percent, while undergraduate FTE enrollment increased 1.8 percent from the previous spring term. The increase in undergraduate enrollment came in the continuing student population, as enrollment by new freshmen and new transfer students declined in this spring term. New freshmen enrollment decreased from 82 to 75 students (8.5 percent), and new transfer enrollment fell from 676 to 665 students (1.6 percent).
- Graduate enrollment totals 2,226 students, down 3.5 percent from the previous spring. Graduate FTE enrollment shows a decrease of 3 percent.

Student Credit Hours by Level and by College



- The total number of student credit hours generated in Spring 2011 is 105,089, increased by 1.3 percent from the previous spring term. This increase came in the upper division undergraduate credit hours (up 3.6 percent), while the number of lower division credit hours fell 1.3 percent and graduate-level credit hours declined 3 percent.
- College of Arts and Sciences generated 72,939 student credit hours, accounting for 69.4 percent of the university total and up nearly 3 percent from the previous spring. Credit hours generated from Academic Development courses increased by almost 1 percent, while student credit hours in the Education and Business disciplines declined 2.1 percent and 4.2 percent, respectively.
