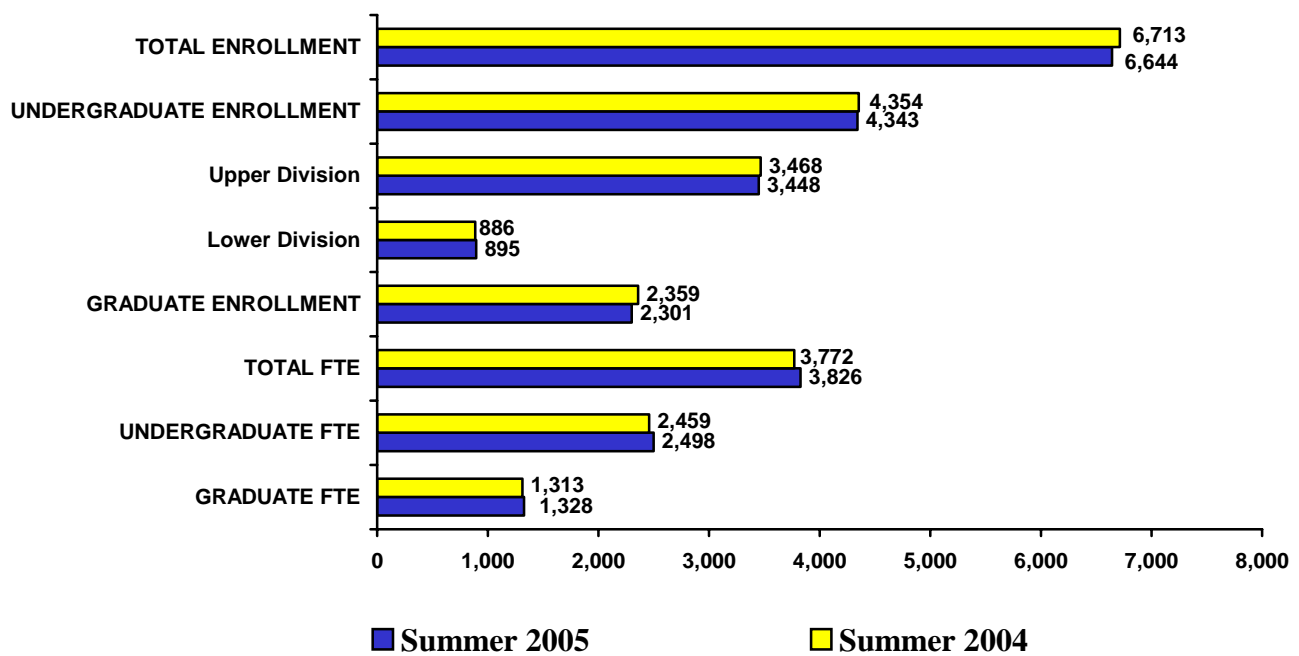


# Enrollment Fact Sheet Summer, 2005

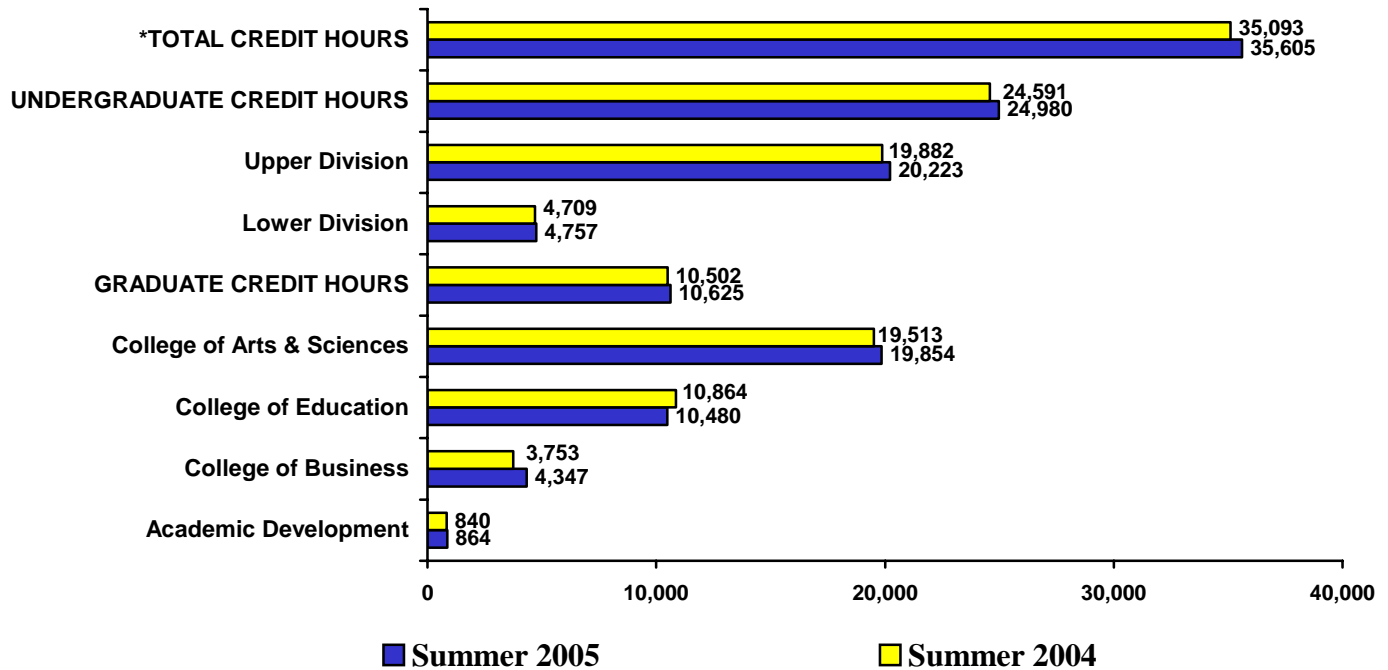

## Comparison of Student Enrollment and FTE



- A comparison with summer 2004 indicates that overall enrollment this summer declined slightly (-1.0%). This was due primarily to a decrease in enrollment at the graduate level (-2.5%).
- At the same time, both undergraduate and graduate student FTE showed a slight increase (1.4%), as did the number of students who enrolled full-time (1.1%) during the summer sessions.

## Comparison of Student Credit Hours by Level and by College



*\*Total Credit Hours includes Honors, NSEP, and non-traditional credit hours.*

- *Credit hour productivity for summer 2005 showed a slight increase (1.5%) over that of the previous summer; additional analysis by college demonstrates that the College of Business and Management had the highest increase (15.8%) in credit hours generated for the summer 2005 sessions.*
