



NEIU and CPS Continuing Endorsement Program

Northeastern Illinois University (NEIU) is excited to announce the continuation of its Chicago Public Schools (CPS) partnership with the CPS Continuing Endorsement Program. The Continuing Endorsement Program offers CPS teachers a pathway to earn Illinois teaching endorsements at a reduced tuition rate. Additionally, completed coursework may also be applied towards the master's degree programs in Special Education, Teaching & Instruction, or ESL Instruction.

Tuition and Costs

Program courses are offered at reduced tuition rates (\$300 per credit hour) with varying total costs depending on the earned endorsement.

BIL/ESL (18 hours) endorsement: \$5,400

LBS I limited (13 hours) endorsement: \$3,900

LBS I PK-21 (27 hours) endorsement: \$8,100

Endorsement Pathways

To best meet the needs of working teachers, the Continuing Endorsement program is offered in two cohorts. The Bilingual and ESL Endorsement program is delivered as a hybrid experience with face-to-face class meetings at NEIU El Centro campus (3390 N. Avondale).

The LBS I Endorsement program is offered in a combination of online and in-person courses with two practicum courses held in the **William Itkin Children's Service Center** on the NEIU main campus (5500 Saint Louis Avenue). The current deadline for Cohort 1 is June 15 and Cohort 2 is November 15, 2017.

Candidate Requirements for Bilingual and ESL Endorsement

Interested candidates must

- A. Apply to the NEIU College of Graduate Studies and Research as a Student-At-Large,
- B. Provide university/college transcripts with evidence of an earned bachelor's degree,
- C. Pass the ISBE Language Proficiency exam in the target language of program (note, not required for ESL endorsement).

Candidate Requirements for LBS I Endorsement

Applying candidates must meet the following requirements for acceptance into the program and:

- A. Earn meet admission requirements to the **NEIU College of Graduate Studies and Research**
 1. Bachelor's degree
 2. Minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale (Previous graduate credit is also taken into consideration.)
 3. Two professional letters of recommendation
 4. Statement of Goals
- B. Provide evidence of a passing score earned on Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP), ACT or SAT. See **NEIU College of Graduate Studies and Research** for minimum passing scores,
- C. Submit valid Illinois State Teaching licensure in one of the listed types: 03, 04, 09 or 10 (other than LBS I),
- D. Provide evidence of clearance of federal criminal background check as required by the University and cooperating school districts, organizations.

Master's Degree Options

Candidates opting to pursue a master's degree program will be directed to the NEIU College of Graduate Studies and Research to apply for full acceptance into the respective program.
